



Notice to Property Owners

Asphalt Road Resurfacing Project



May 17th, 2016

This notice is being sent to Property Owners on the following roadway segments as these roadways will receive a maintenance overlay this summer. (Please see map on back page)

Kirkwood Avenue - Layton Avenue to Pulaski Avenue

Martin Avenue - Packard Avenue to Lake Drive

Edgerton Avenue - Swift Avenue to Lake Drive

Pulaski Avenue - Lake Drive to Sheridan Drive

Hammond Avenue - Packard Avenue to Swift Avenue

Grange Avenue - Packard Avenue to Lake Drive

Beginning the second week of June, the City of Cudahy will begin resurfacing work on the above streets. Please understand, this schedule may change due to weather related delays. This letter serves to provide information relative to the project and to address common questions the public has regarding projects such as this. What work is being done? During the next several weeks, manholes, storm inlets, and water valves will be repaired by the City's Department of Public Works in preparation for the road to be resurfaced. The City has hired Payne & Dolan to mill & overlay the pavement. They will bring in a very large machine to mill (grind) off some areas of the pavement. This work will take about a ½ day to do. Another crew will come in to place a 2" lift of asphalt on the roadway. There may be several days between when the street is milled and when it gets paved. This is typical and allows the City to address any subgrade issues before the new pavement is placed. **This work is considered "temporary" compared to full reconstruction which replaces curbs, removes road, and subgrade. This work is done intentionally to buy time until the road can be fully reconstructed. Please note only certain roads qualify for this method, many roads may seem worse, but may not warrant a mill/overlay and can only be reconstructed.**

Will I be able to get to my home? During construction you will be able to get to and from your home. When they are working there will be one lane open. They will have a flagger who will flag you around the equipment. There will be no parking allowed while the street is under construction. Temporary No Parking signs will be placed a day before construction begins and will remain up until the pavement is placed. If you choose to disregard these signs and park on the street, your car will be ticketed and towed. Please drive slowly and use extreme caution when driving through the work area as there will be manholes and water valve boxes that will stick up. Any severe obstructions and/or excavations will be marked with barricades.

How long will the construction last? The contractor is expected to start sometime during the second week of June (June 6th to 10th). Completion is very dependent on the weather, but the City is expecting that the paving work would be completed within a week of starting.

Will my garbage or mail service be interrupted? During the construction mail delivery and garbage collection should not be interrupted.

Will I have to pay for it? No, this work is not being special assessed and is being funded with money generated by taxes.



Your cooperation and understanding will greatly assist us in completing this work in the shortest time possible. We apologize for any inconvenience that this work may cause you. Please remember that construction equipment is extremely dangerous and children must be kept away from the construction area at all times.
