




PACKARD AVENUE UTILITY CONSTRUCTION TO CONTINUE NORTH

The sewer and water replacement on Packard Avenue between Allerton Avenue and Lunham Avenue will start Tuesday November 8th. Although property owners on Packard Avenue have already received information about the project, we are informing residents that live directly within the next phase of construction. This is typical for projects of this magnitude and is what we have done for previous projects such as the downtown reconstruction. The City has regular meetings with the Contractor in order to finalize schedules and coordinate efforts with the School District and Milwaukee County Transit.



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- **Tuesday, November 8th, 2016** the contractor plans to start the next phase of construction North of Allerton Ave. They will first install the traffic control to close the road and mobilize equipment and material to the jobsite. The Contractor will then begin on the Sanitary Sewer relay between Lunham and Allerton Avenue.
 - **The primary detour route will remain on Kingan Avenue from Plankinton to Lunham.** All traffic including local bus routes will continue to run down this road. Temporary signs for bus routes and bus stop locations are posted accordingly.
 - **Allerton Avenue** - The East and West directions of traffic shall remain open across Packard Avenue for Lincoln Elementary School Pickup and drop-off. There will be a short period of time when temporary asphalt will be patched within this intersection. This work should not interrupt the pick-up and drop-off times. If there are any issues, the school district will be notified so that they can inform parents and staff.
 - **Lunham Avenue** - The East and West directions of traffic shall remain open across Packard Avenue. There will be some days where work will take place in this intersection and may require full closure. Please follow posted temporary detour signage. We will do our best to coordinate with the Contractor to maintain the traffic flow and bus routes through this intersection. Typically this will mean avoiding work during peak traffic flows during school starting and closing (7:30 AM - 8:30AM & 2:30 PM - 3:30 PM).
 - **Important! Alleys are not meant to be used as detour routes.** Local traffic shall follow the posted detour routes along the side streets. The alleys are to be used only as access for property owners that live along the alley and not as a main thoroughfare.
 - **NO PARKING will be in effect on Packard Ave.** within the construction zones, including the detour route, and some of the adjacent side streets. The entire the road will be closed off.
 - **Night time parking permit holders for Packard Ave. are directed to park on adjacent side streets as close to Packard Ave. as possible.** They must be legally parked, and must park in areas without posted no-parking signs. Police department odd/even night parking restrictions still apply for surrounding blocks, unless noted otherwise.
 - **Sewer & Water Work** - When multiple utilities are reconstructed it seems like there is a lot of jumping around. This is intentional because the Contractor starts with the relay of the sanitary sewer, then the water main, and finally the storm sewer. After all of the main line work is complete, the Contractor will come back and install the private laterals to the properties.
 - **Once the work has been completed between Cudahy Ave. and Allerton Ave,** the first phase will be temporarily paved for the winter and opened up to local traffic. There will be roughly a week when both phases of the construction are closed to traffic North and South of Allerton as the contractor begins the work between Allerton & Lunham. It is expected that we will be opening the stretch between Cudahy & Allerton mid-November.
