

**MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THE CITY OF CUDAHY RULES, LAWS AND LICENSE COMMITTEE
HELD AT THE CUDAHY MUNICIPAL BUILDING, 5050 S. LAKE DR., MILWAUKEE COUNTY,
WISCONSIN ON WEDNESDAY, DECEMBER 7, 2011**

Aldersperson Mikolajczak called the meeting to order at 6:00 PM with the following answering present to roll call: Richard Haske, Greg Witkowski, Ald. Bartoshevich, and Attorney Eberhardy. Janet St. Louis was absent and excused. Clerk/Treasurer Broderick and Chief Poellot were also in attendance.

OPEN MEETING STATEMENT

The proper open meeting statement was read.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

1. Approval of minutes from the meeting held November 2, 2011. **MOTION BY HASKE, SECOND BY WITKOWSKI** to approve. Motion carried unanimously.

NEW BUSINESS

1. Discussion and appropriate action regarding request of Kim Maddox for Used Auto Dealer License at 4949 S. Packard Ave. **MOTION BY BARTOSHEVICH, SECOND BY HASKE** to approve pending background check. Motion carried unanimously.
2. Discussion and appropriate action regarding request of Anthony M. Palivoda for Salvage yard License at 5510 S. Whitnall Avenue. It was noted that the same company is running the business; it has just changed the name. **MOTION BY WITKOWSKI, SECOND BY HASKE** to approve pending background check. Motion carried unanimously.

OLD BUSINESS

1. Discussion and appropriate action regarding City owned building ban on weapons. **MOTION BY BARTOSHEVICH, SECOND BY HASKE** to bring this item back from the table. On the roll call vote, Bartoshevich, Mikolajczak and Haske voted "aye". Witkowski voted "no". Motion carried. City Attorney Eberhardy explained that Act 35 makes it legal to carry weapons within the State of Wisconsin. City Attorney Eberhardy previously explained that the decision that needs to be made is whether or not the City wants to allow the public who have permits to carry a concealed weapon, to be able to bring concealed weapons into City owned buildings. He noted that there are liability issues. If we do absolutely nothing, the City would have absolute immunity under the statute. That means no ban on weapons and somebody comes in and shoots up the place, the City is absolutely immune. If the City does post signs, we may be liable. Lengthy discussion ensued. **MOTION BY BARTOSHEVICH, SECOND BY WITKOWSKI** to recommend allowing concealed carry in city owned buildings unless contrary to statutory exceptions. Motion carried unanimously.

Adjourn. **MOTION BY BARTOSHEVICH, SECOND BY HASKE** to adjourn. Motion carried unanimously.
